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

ANIMALS

Groups of animals

Animals are put into two big groups. These are <u>vertebrates</u> and <u>invertebrates</u>.

1. Vertebrates: These are animals with a backbone or spine. These animals have bones in their bodies. These bones make up a skeleton and it's the skeleton which gives them shape. Vertebrates are usually big animals.

Examples

- 1. Mammals: dogs, human beings, cats, bats, cattle, hares, leopard, lion and many others. They are cold blooded animals which give birth to their young ones and feed them with milk. They have hair / fur which covers their bodies so as to keep warm.
- 2. Reptiles: lizard, crocodile, tortoise, turtle and snakes. They are cold blooded and their bodies are covered with scales or a shell.
- 3. Amphibians: frog, newt, tadpole. They are cold blooded animals and live on both land and in water. They breed in water or damp places.
- 4. Birds: chicken, owls, doves, eagles, pigeons, ducks, ostriches. They are warm blooded vertebrates with bodies covered in feathers.
- 5. Fish: shark, tiger fish, bream, kapenta, salmon. Their bodies are covered with scales others do not have scales, such as the barbell fish and helicopter fish.

Animals with a Backbone!

Mammals

Mammals are animals that have hair, are warm-blooded, and drink milk when they are babies.



Birds

Birds are warm-blooded, have wings, feathers, a beak, and their babies hatch from eggs.



Reptiles

Reptiles have scales, breathe air, are cold-blooded, and usually lay eggs on land.



Amphibians

Amphibians spend part of their lives in water and part on land and they are cold-blooded.




Fish


Fish live in water, have gills to breathe, scales and fins on their bodies, and are cold-blooded.
