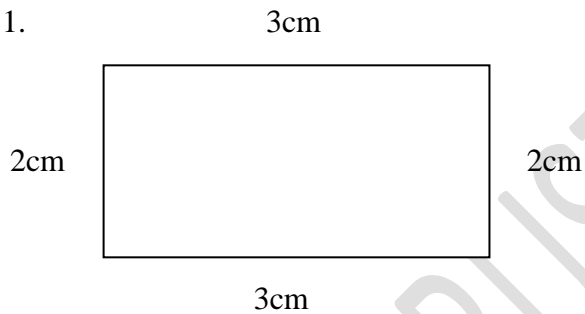
PERIMETER

Find the perimeter.

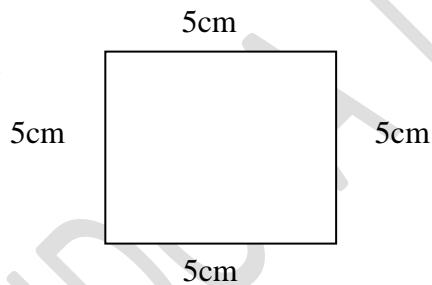
